

Get a phone number from at least two members of the opposite sex.

Find three opinions on Prof. Shim's classes, and whether she gives a lot of homework.

Find three people who like the same kind of music you like.

Find out whether three people in the class are single/available or not.

Find out at least three good places for some specific kind of shopping that you're interested in.

Find out what the three most attractive members of the class are doing for their winter holidays.

Find out the plans for next semester for at least 3 people in the class.

Recommend at least three people to take a class from your favorite professor.

Recommend your favorite book or author to at least three people.

Find out the political views of the three most interesting people in the room on any subject of your choice.

Ask for favors from three people in the room, in such a way that they agree to help you.

Find out the name of the hair-stylist shop for the three people with the best haircuts in the room.

Discuss your views on Harry Potter (or some other famous series of movies or books) with at least three people in the room.

Get at least three people to accept an invitation to an outing at some time after today's cocktail party. (It can be next week, or after exams.) Get their contact information, and make a basic plan.

Ask at least three people their opinion on some current event in the news these days. Regardless of your real opinion, disagree with them in a friendly, positive way.

Find out where the three people wearing the most attractive footwear bought those shoes/boots.

Get advice from at least three people on a good way to deal with a difficult professor.

Find out the names of at least three different popular spots in Hongdae from your classmates. They can be places to eat, to dance, or to sit with a coffee, depending on your personal style, but you must discuss the topic with a few people.

If you are single, get at least three people in the class to agree to set up a blind date for you. (If you are not single or not interested in dating, then offer to set up a blind date for at least three people in the class who *are* single.)

Convince at least three of your classmates to go to some kind of upcoming event with you, such as a concert or movie screening.

This is a simple form for you to use after the cocktail party. You can write down any notes you need here. When the cocktail party is over, it's a good idea to write some notes on the back, for the information you collected, etc.

For Monday's class (Dec. 15th) please write down about your experience in the cocktail party. You can mention which tasks you fulfilled and how well you did them, as well as mentioning who you talked to in order to fulfill them. (Please type your thoughts.)

I'm also curious about your thoughts on the experience of this cocktail party. Did you find that dressing differently, and holding class in a different setting, had any effect on your speaking and listening abilities? If so, did it make it easier or more challenging to talk and listen?
